

D. Magazines/Newspapers/Encyclopedias: if you listed these in your bibliography, select two you judge might give you significant information on your topic.

1. You are to read the magazines, newspapers, encyclopedias in their entirety. Note the most important points.
2. You are expected to become familiar with important information that can be used as a basis for your interpretation of your topic when writing the final essay.

E. Web Sites: Select the most important website cited in your bibliography.

1. You are expected to become familiar with the entire contents of the website.
2. Write a useful summary as described above and note important dates, events, and occurrences that site reveals.

F. Youtube: Select the most important video cited in your bibliography.

1. Write a useful summary of the clip.
2. Note important dates, events, and occurrences.

G. Please note: If your topic has not been treated adequately in book form, you will be required to consult additional scholarly journals (instead of two, four), not just newspapers or commercial magazines, and summarize appropriately. Do not base your summations on just newspapers, magazines, and encyclopedias; you must use scholarly material. Please contact me (Fraga) for help.

IV. You are now ready to organize your summarized information into a report.

V. Steps to submitting summary information:

A. Three-part procedure to follow in submitting summaries and list of details (or timelines).

1. **Title Page:** Name, Course, Group Category, Topic, Date, Summation of Sources

2. **Summary Information:** your information should follow the format below:
