General Guidelines for MLA Style References

- References in MLA are cited on a separate page at the end of the document
- Page should be titled: Works Cited - centered at the top of the page
- Entries are alphabetized by the first letter of the entry
- Entire page should be **double spaced** and formatted with a hanging indent
- In-text citations are (last name page number). If no page number is included, just give last name (or title in quotation marks if no author)
- For online sources, location must be given. Options in order of preference are: DOI, permalink, URL

- There can be more than one correct way to cite a specific source – focus on what your reader would need to know to find it
- To cite a format not shown here, use the template on the reverse of this handout

MLA 8 is designed around the idea of **containers**. A book is its own container, while an article may be contained in a journal (Container 1), which is contained in a database (Container 2). Use the template to determine how to organize your citation. There may not be information for each section of the template – **just fill in the categories that are relevant to your particular source**
