	<p>List the first clause with its title here. Don't forget the sub-clauses.</p>	<p>After you are done with the previous contract, list the first clause here, and identify its type of contact. Then, see if any of the clauses listed for the other contract are of the same type.</p>	
	<p>Next, apply the sub-clause test: "Is there any critical information to the contract in the clause, which is not accounted by the title?" If so, then, circle the content, label it 'a', give it a sub-clause title, and list it here. If not, proceed to the next clause, and repeat the process, until getting it to the end.</p>	<p>If so, then give it the same name, but do not change its number. Next, list all sub-clauses listed for the clause, and apply the sub-clause test, like you did before. Repeat the process until the last clause. Finally, if any of the clauses were not of the same type of the other contract, then give it a title that matches its unique type. Try to keep it short to 1 or 2 words.</p>

You will see it word by word, and compare EACH clause from both contracts that have the same title. You will create a list for each contract explaining what is missing from each contract. Don't just mention the title of each clause and sub-clause, write the contents in details.

For clause # 1, the information missing is.....(list all content...yes, write every word, not just the titles)”.

Proceed all the way to the last clause.

Remember to also list the entire clauses with different titles.

Repeat the process for the other contract.

here is how you answer it

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Create a list of all the clauses you did NOT see on either contract, which you believe could be useful/protect either party to the contract. Mediation, arbitration, legal costs, penalties, terms, assignments, and any other clauses that could limit liability, increase control, make it fair, and improve ethics are good candidates.
