

Annotated Bibliography Guidelines – ENG 103

One of the most essential skills to the composing process – in terms of academic or scholarly writing at least – is the ability to locate and implement necessary and relevant information. The annotated bibliography is a way for us to approach this process in an organized and cohesive manner. The assignment will require that we:

- 1) Locate reliable sources including books and peer-reviewed journal articles
- 2) Read through those sources to get a full understanding of their meaning
- 3) Decide which of those sources might be beneficial to the project at hand (whatever you now realize you've been working towards all semester)
- 4) Locate all relevant bibliographic data for each source
- 5) Compose a bibliographic entry according to the appropriate style guidelines (the default is MLA style unless your particular topic requires otherwise... the sciences will require APA)
- 6) Compose a single paragraph summary/abstract of each source
- 7) Compose a single paragraph evaluation of the source that considers the relationship between the source and your own research while taking Diana Hacker's reliability guidelines into consideration.

The specifics:

- The bibliography should consist of EIGHT entries
- A maximum of TWO of these may be website sources
- There needs to be a *minimum of one* paper book included in the bibliography
- Encyclopedias/dictionaries (including Wikipedia) do not count as reliable sources for an academic project of this nature
- The entries should be listed in alphabetical order
- The entries should be properly formatted (you can use a site like citation machine or easy bib, or a program like Microsoft word for this) and utilize a hanging indent
