

Experimental Project Draft

For this writing assignment you will be participating in an online experiment and then writing a research paper on that topic. You will be writing the paper as if you were one of the researchers responsible for the experiment you participated in. A short research paper that will include the following components:

- A title page
- A brief introduction to your study which will include descriptions of at least 2 relevant psychological research articles published within the last 15 years (2000 – 2016)
- A method section
- A references section

All components of your paper must be in APA format and written in your own words. No quotes are permitted in this writing assignment.

The Experiment

You should have selected one of the approved experiments on the APA Online Psychology Laboratory page to use for this assignment as part of Writing Assignment 1. If you haven't participated in the study you selected you should do that before you begin working on your paper. If you have decided that you would like to change the experiment you'll be using for this project, please e-mail to discuss this before you begin your paper.

Experimental Project Draft

Your paper will contain the following four components:

- A title page
- A brief introduction to your study which will include descriptions of at least 2 relevant psychological research articles published within the last 15 years (2000 – 2016)
- A method section
- A references section

Each will be explained below.

1. A title page

Your title page should be a single page that includes the following information: a header with your running head and page number, the title of your paper, your name, and your affiliation.

2. Introduction

Your introduction section should introduce your research question to the reader and provide information about previous research to justify and motivate your own hypothesis. **Remember that you are writing your paper from the perspective of the researcher who designed the experiment you selected, so you should be using the same research question described on the OPL website.** If you aren't sure what the research question is, please contact us to ask for help! For your draft of this section, I would encourage you to try and write at least two

pages (although you can always write more - remember that more content allows us to give more feedback!). Your draft should contain the following information:

- An introductory paragraph that discusses the general question or problem that you plan to investigate. This paragraph should end with your research question.
 - This paragraph should provide the basic motivation for why your study is necessary and what you are investigating.
- A detailed description of at least 2 specific research studies that relates to your topic
 - These must be psychological studies published in a peer reviewed journal within the last 15 years
 - Your description should include:
 - What the researchers did, including:
 - An identification of the hypothesis
 - A brief (1 – 2 sentence) description of the sample
 - A brief (3 – 5 sentence) description of the materials and procedure used
 - What they found, including:
 - An identification of the statistical test(s) used
 - A statement of whether or not they found support for their hypothesis
 - A brief (2 – 3 sentence) discussion of the specific findings
 - An explanation of what the results mean in relation to your own study.
 - Consider critiquing the previous study (e.g., identify flaws or issues with the research), discussing limitations of the study (e.g., what else could have been explored or included), or identifying how this work could be built on by additional research.

Each description should be about ½ - 1 page in length. The goal when describing each study is to provide further motivation for your study, and to help build an argument for your hypothesis. Be sure to cite the study you're describing once per paragraph in APA format.

- A closing paragraph that identifies your hypothesis and provides a brief description of the goals and basic methodology for your study.

Since you'll be basing your paper on the study you participated in, you can use the information included on the Online Psychology Laboratory (OPL) website for each study to help you get started. To access this information, click on the title then select "No, but tell me more about this experiment". This will bring you to a new page that describes the study and relevant background research. References are included at the end of each description.

3. Method

The purpose of the method section is to describe your study in sufficient detail so that your reader could replicate your work. **For this paper, you will describe the procedure for the study you participated in from the perspective of the researcher.** This means that you should write the method section as if you designed and ran the study. You will need to read the description of the study to write this section as you may not be exposed to all conditions as the participant. To access this information, click on the title then select "No, but tell me more about this experiment". This will bring you to a new page that describes the study and relevant background research. **You should not describe this study from the point of view of the participant!**

For most students, the method section will be between 1-2 pages in length. It should include the following information:

- A participants' subsection. This should describe how many people participated, who the participants were, what [if anything] they received as compensation, and basic demographic information (e.g., gender, race, age, etc).
 - **At this point, you won't be able to provide a precise description of your participants, but you can still provide the outline of this section. You can either make up numbers or include XXX for any information you do not have at this time.**
 - Note that participants in this study will be psychology students who will receive extra credit for their participation
- A materials subsection. This should describe the materials used in the study. You can begin your description using the content provided on the OPL website as well as your own experience completing the study.
- A procedure subsection. This describes what participants did in your study step by step. This will likely be short, but should specify that the study was run online, describe the general procedure, and give an estimate of how long the survey will take to complete. Remember that you must address all conditions in the study, not just those you personally experienced.

4. References

In this section, you will provide references in APA format for all of the sources that you cited in the current draft of your paper. You should also cite the OPL website (see this page for information on how to do this: <http://opl.apa.org/APACitationPage.htm>). **Do not include references for any papers that you haven't cited, even if you plan to cite them in future drafts!** Keep in mind that you do not need to include all of your references, but you should at minimum three references for this draft.

Formatting and Submission Requirements

All components of the paper must be written in your own words (no quotes allowed!) and comply with APA formatting. See the APA manual and/or Appendix A of our textbook for more information about this.

Your paper, including all of the information listed above, should be saved as a single document. You must save your document as a .doc, .docx, .pdf, .rtf, .wpd, or .wps. file.
