PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of THE UNITED STATES, of SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA.
 The petition of Ramon Rodriguez hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
 First. My place of residence is 111 "D" Street, San Francisco, California.
 Second. My occupation is Philipine Islands.
 Third. I was born on the 31 day of August, anno Domini 1899, at Philippine Islands.
 (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)
 Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Philippines, on or about the 1 day of January, anno Domini 1910, on the 1 day of January, anno Domini 1910, on the vessel U.S.A.
 Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 1 day of January, anno Domini 1910, in the Court of U.S.A.
 Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is None; she was born on the 1 day of January, anno Domini 1910, at None, and now resides at None.

 I have 0 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: None.

THE PETITION IS FILED, DURING THE
PRESIDENCY OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS
IN THE YEAR OF CONGRESS 1910, (A.D. 1910.)

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Philippines, wherein at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the day of July, anno Domini 1910, and in the State of California, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the day of July, anno Domini 1910, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of U.S.A. on the 1 day of January, anno Domini 1910, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: None, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavits and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
