PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of THE UNITED STATES at SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

The petition of Marsiano Rogue U.S. Navy S. F. Cal

First. My place of residence is U.S. Navy (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is U.S. Navy

Third. I was born on the 16 day of April, anno Domini 1895, at Bulacan, Pd

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Philippines on or about the 15 day of Dec, anno Domini 1901, and arrived in the United States, at the port of San Francisco, on the 15 day of Dec, anno Domini 1901, on the vessel U.S. Navy (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 15 day of Jan, anno Domini 1921, at San Francisco, in the U.S. Navy Court of Dec, anno Domini 1901

Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is None; she was born on the 15 day of Dec, anno Domini 1901 at Philippines, and now resides at U.S. Navy (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I have one child, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: Name unknown, born Nov 1920 at Madras, Res. Philadelphia

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to American Government of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 15 day of May, anno Domini 1913, and in the State of CALIFORNIA, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 26 day of Jan, anno Domini 1921, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the U.S. Navy Court of Dec, anno Domini 1901, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: None and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
